

You're not seeing double – there are 2 sheriffs in town

The High Sheriffs of Hertfordshire and Buckinghamshire took a day-long tour of Dacorum this week.

On Monday the Mayor of Dacorum, Cllr Stephen Holmes, escorted both High Sheriffs, Janie Wentworth-Stanley and Allan Westray around the borough, giving them a flavour of some of the big issues for Dacorum, as well as showcasing some of its best assets.

As part of the afternoon's agenda, the High Sheriffs paid a visit to Lagley Hall in Berkhamsted, one of the borough's 33 sheltered housing schemes for people aged 65 years and over.

The Zoological Museum at Tring, which showcases the largest collection of stuffed mammals, birds, reptiles and insects in the UK, was also on the itinerary.

The tour also included a visit to Tring Park Arts Educational School, with a performance from ballet pupils. The school was established in 1945 and provides specialist education in the performing arts for girls and boys who show a particular talent in dance, drama or music.

The Mayor of Dacorum, Councillor Stephen Holmes, said "We are delighted to have the High Sheriffs visit Dacorum.

"I was proud to escort them around the Borough – it's a fantastic chance to showcase some of Dacorum's best assets and to show them some of the issues faced by local people and how we're working to address them."
