

Study Leave and Post-Examination Policy

Study Leave

We understand the importance of revision for public examinations and therefore, where appropriate, we provide students with the opportunity for additional study time during the exam period.

1. All Y11 and Y13 Boarders are expected to register as normal for the morning and afternoon. Day students may come in either in time for morning registration or just the afternoon. If you are not coming in for the morning then attendance@tringpark.com should be informed and this will be recorded as an authorised absence.
2. Once in school we expect students to be quietly studying, or if exams have finished, quietly engaged in something that will not disturb others.
3. At the discretion of staff, students may be in their dorms (boarders), in the Sixth Form Common Room or in classrooms with their teachers. Teachers will be available and having a change of scenery, as well as their input, can be helpful.
4. Students may not leave school (e.g. into Tring) until lunchtime (12:30) at which point they must sign out.
5. Boarders will not be allowed into Tring in the evenings during evening Prep time, until **all** A level examinations are completed.
6. All pupils are expected to attend their vocational lessons as timetabled. Additional study time during vocational classes is given at the discretion of the Director of department.

Owing to the demands of running both an academic and vocational curriculum at Tring Park School we, unlike some boarding schools, cannot allow complete absence from school for study leave. There are performances up to the end of the summer term and it is important that pupils are available for rehearsals as required.

Post-Examination Period

The school expects all pupils to be in school as normal in the period between the end of examinations and Founders' Day. Year 11 pupils will have a structured post exam programme during their academic time and Year 13 pupils will be involved in additional rehearsals and classes for the end of year events. This time is a normal working period for the school and all pupils are involved in either rehearsals or lessons. Should parents choose to withdraw their child from school before the end of term then, regrettably, the pupil will not be permitted to return for either Founders' Day or the Leavers Celebration events.
