It is a short but intense and emotional finale before the term ends so savour every last moment between now and Founders' Day!

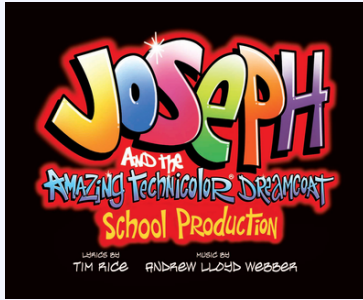

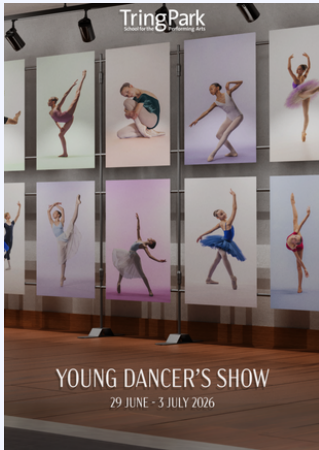
